Passages in Today's Sermon  
1Peter 2:24

*Jesus is described as someone who was worthy of all glory but chose to serve instead. What's your reaction to that kind of God? Is it appealing, confusing, hard to believe—or something else?*

*If it were true that your worth wasn't something you had to earn or prove—that it was already settled—how do you think that would change the way you live?*

*The sermon suggests that theology can "anchor" us and keep us grounded. Have you thought about theology like that, why or why not?*

*The sermon introduced some big words—like "ontological Trinity" and "economic Trinity." You don't need to memorize them, but what's the basic idea? How would you explain it to a friend in your own words?*

*How does knowing that Jesus—who was worthy of all glory—chose to serve change the way you think about serving others?*

*Digging Deeper*

*The sermon ended with the idea of being "eager to serve." On a scale of 1-10, how eager are you right now? What's one thing that might help move that number up?*

*The distinction between ontological Trinity (who God is) and economic Trinity (what God does) suggests that role and worth are not the same thing. How does this truth speak people who are confused about their identity?*
