

*Acts 24:27 tells us that Paul had been waiting in prison for two years before Festus arrived. When you've been stuck waiting on something for a long time, what happens to your sense of purpose?*

*In Acts 26:4-11, Paul describes his life before he met Jesus. How honest is he about who he used to be, and why might he start his defense there rather than skipping to the good part?*

*Read Acts 25:1-12. Festus suggests moving the trial back to Jerusalem, and Paul appeals to Caesar instead. What do Paul's words in verses 10-11 reveal about how he understood his situation and his rights?*

*Sam said the one person who won't find forgiveness is the one who doesn't think they need it. Why is admitting we're the problem so much harder than pointing to someone else's fault?*

*Read Acts 26:19-23. Paul sums up his whole message in a few sentences. How would you put what he says the prophets and Moses foretold into your own words?*

*The sermon said Paul leveraged his earthly citizenship for the sake of his heavenly citizenship. In what areas of your life is your earthly citizenship louder than your citizenship in Christ's kingdom?*
